

Your First Appointment

What to bring to your first appointment

If you have insurance, bring your insurance card or other proof of insurance and proof of residency.

If you do not have insurance, contact our Enrollment Counselors <u>BEFORE</u> your first visit:

- Bring **proof of income**, such as pay stub, income tax form, letter from employer
- For Sliding Scale discounts, bring proof that you live in Marin County

Download, **print**, **fill out**, and **bring** the following forms: <u>www.marinclinic.org/health-care-services/new-patients</u>

- Patient Registration
- Patient Questionnaire
- Notice of Privacy Practices (NPP)
- Acknowledgment of Receipt of NPP

Bring a full list of prescription medications, over-thecounter medications, remedies and herbs that you are currently taking; if possible, bring medication bottles.

Bring your medical record, test results or immunization records you may have had elsewhere, and glucometer, blood sugar readings log, blood pressure log, and nutritional log.

Arrive 30 minutes before your first appointment.
