Mass Vaccination - Meet the "Equity POD"

The County of Marin has been working in collaboration with several organizations to run COVID-19 Vaccine Points of Distribution (POD) to vaccinate Marin residents. The Equity POD is set up at Marin Community Clinics' Campus Clinic and has been operating since late January.

There is increasing evidence that some racial and ethnic groups are being disproportionately affected by COVID-19. Deep-rooted systemic health and social inequities are causes for the increased risk of contracting COVID-19. The Equity POD is dedicated to ensuring equitable access to the vaccine.

"The Equity POD's goal is to eliminate or at least reduce the barriers for vaccination for vulnerable populations," explains **Lisa Ward, MD, MsPH, MS**, Novato Regional Medical Director. Together, the Clinics and the County, staff the Equity POD and coordinate its operations. Three to four hundred vaccines are provided a day, and as of March 13, over 8,000 patients and community members have been vaccinated at this site.


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CLINICS CEO RECEIVES EXCELLENCE IN LEADERSHIP AWARD
