Associate Social Work Fellowship

This clinical fellowship provides all of the above plus the ability to complete your supervised hours for licensure in a supportive cohort-model.

Qualifications:

- Bilingual (Spanish/English)
- Recent Master's of Social Work (MSW) graduate
- Registered with the Board of Behavioral Sciences (must have ASW number before start date)
- Comfortable in a fast paced environment
- Willing and able to work with diverse populations
- Have completed clinical course work
- Able to work full-time, in person in Marin County, CA (Fellowship is not offered remotely)

Objectives:

The program will provide high level training in Integrated Behavioral Health (IBH) including multiple evidenced-based treatment models, within the context of providing care to the underserved and culturally diverse population we serve at Marin Community Clinics (MCC).

MCC's Integrated Behavioral Health ASW Fellowship was created to produce highly skilled, culturally sensitive, and trauma aware clinicians who will become the next generation of IBH clinicians and leaders. We welcome applications from diverse applicants and are particularly passionate about mentoring and training Latinx-identified/BIPOC clinicians.

Fellowship clinicians complete assessments, treatment, and resourcing to a diverse underserved population while simultaneously obtaining high quality clinical training and supervision of their hours for licensure.

Fellowship Details:

The Fellowship involves monthly didactics promoting the Core Competencies of IBH including a special focus on evidenced-based treatment models.

The fellowship includes:

- Competitive salary and benefits
- weekly clinical supervision
- shadowing various providers
- direct patient care
- monthly 1-1 mentorship meetings with Latinx clinicians
- case management
- resourcing and managing a caseload of individual and group therapy patients.

The fellowship has two tracks- Child and Family Track, and Generalist Track.

The cohort will train together, but responsibilities will differ between the tracks.
